
LMS Principal's Post 1/19/19

Along with weather appropriate outdoor gear, *please send your children to school with indoor shoes and LAYERS*; *sweatshirts and long sleeves specifically.* We have a large number of students wearing boots and coats indoors each day and learning takes place best when students are appropriately warm and dry.

Substitutes Needed:

Substitute Teachers are important members of our RSU 23 team, charged with moving the learning process forward in the regular teacher's absence, along with maintaining classroom discipline, routines and student safety.

The need for trained substitutes is always great and we encourage those of you who might be interested to consider taking the **Substitute Teacher Certification Class**. This is a five week, ten session program that will prepare you to be a successful substitute teacher. Class completion guarantees participants course fee reimbursement once hired by either RSU 23 or the Saco School Department, along with a higher rate of pay. Basic requirements for substitutes include a high school diploma, agreeing to fingerprinting and a criminal history record check. Info from the Nurse's Office:

As I'm sure you are well aware, cold and flu season is upon us. I'm reaching out with a reminder of the guidelines for when your children should come to school and when it may be best to keep them home. Our goal is to keep everyone as healthy as possible for optimal learning at Loranger School.

First of all, it's perfectly OK to send your child to school with a runny nose or a little cough with no other symptoms. After a fever or vomiting, please wait 24hrs without fever reducing medicines or vomiting before sending your child back to school. I would ask that you keep your child home when the following symptoms exist: temperature of 100 degrees or above, vomiting, diarrhea, frequent cough, cough with phlegm and/or cough that sounds like a bark. Call the child's doctor with a temperature higher than 100 degrees for more that 2 days, vomiting or diarrhea for more than 2 days, or severe cough accompanied by a sore throat or wheezing. With rashes, use your judgement and seek medical attention for a rash that blisters, develops pus, or is very uncomfortable.

Please feel free to reach out to me anytime with questions regarding any health issues you may be facing with your child. I am certainly here to help! I would also ask if you are calling your child out sick that you let the office personnel know the nature of the illness as I also am mandated to track illness symptomology for the Maine CDC, particularly communicable disease like Pertussis, Strep and rash related illnesses such as Fifth's Disease.

Thank you very much for your cooperation. Here's to getting through this season as healthy as possible!
